HOST A FOREIGN STUDENT

Local host families are needed for the 2018-2019 school year for international students wanting to attend Campion Academy! Leaving one's family to fly around the world and study in a foreign land and a second language is an intense and life-changing experience for a young person. Families that have opened their homes and hearts to host one of these adventurers have a unique opportunity to make an impact on a young life.

Since 2014, Campion Academy has partnered with an organization called A+ Global Education, Inc. (aplusge.com). A+, led by a team of dedicated, Christian leaders, helps to recruit foreign students for Campion. In addition to arranging academic placement, A+ also recruits local families to host these students and provides full-time, local support to the host family and the foreign student. Host families are paid approximately \$1000 a month which is more than enough to cover any expenses associated with hosting.

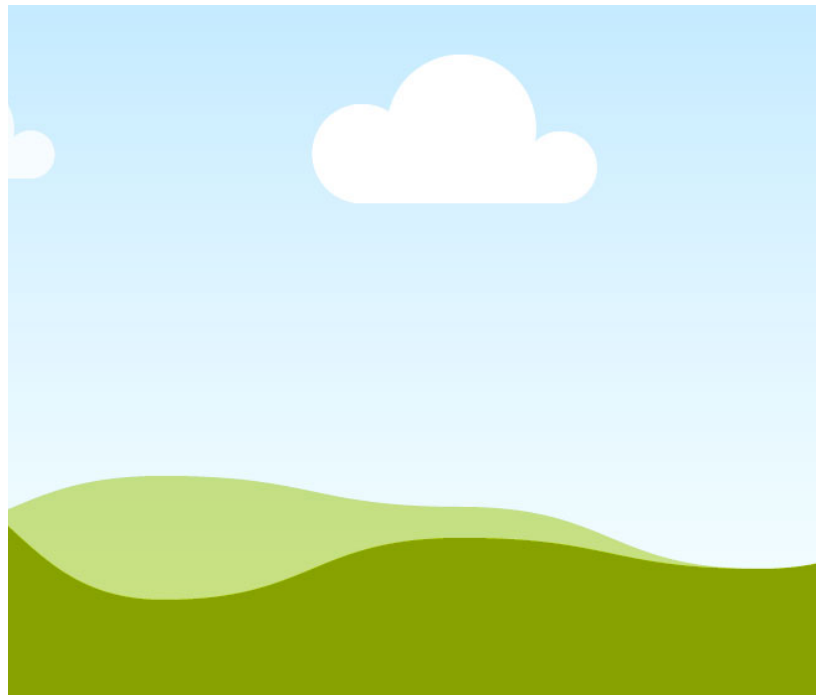
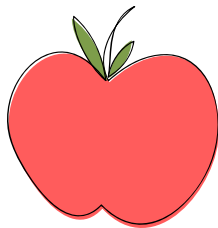
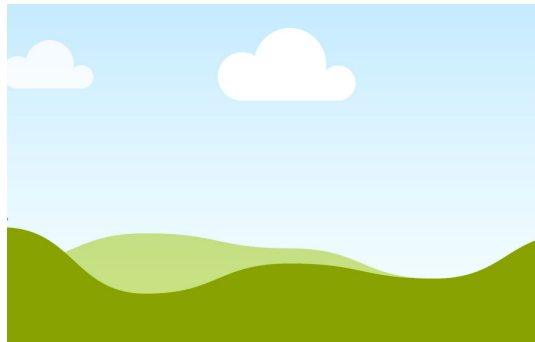
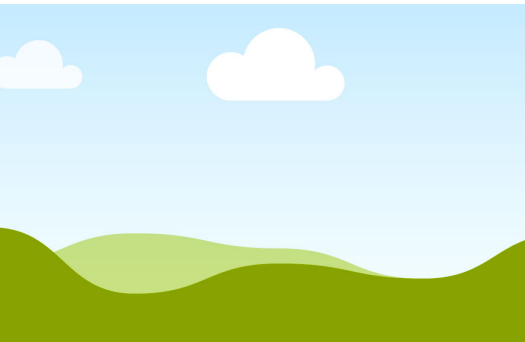
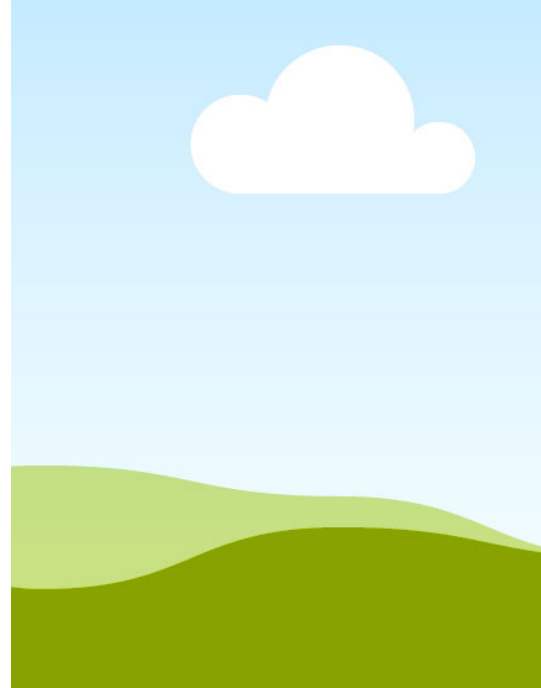
Dear Parents,

Happy Monday!

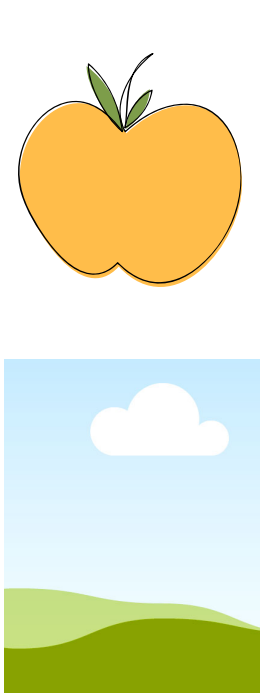
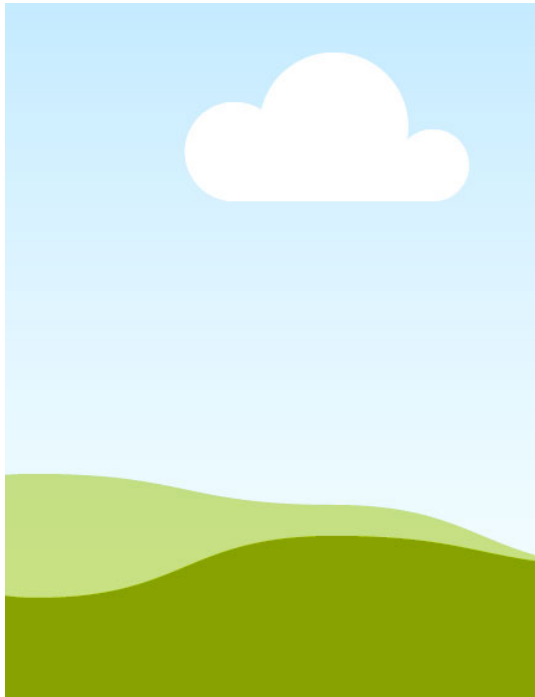
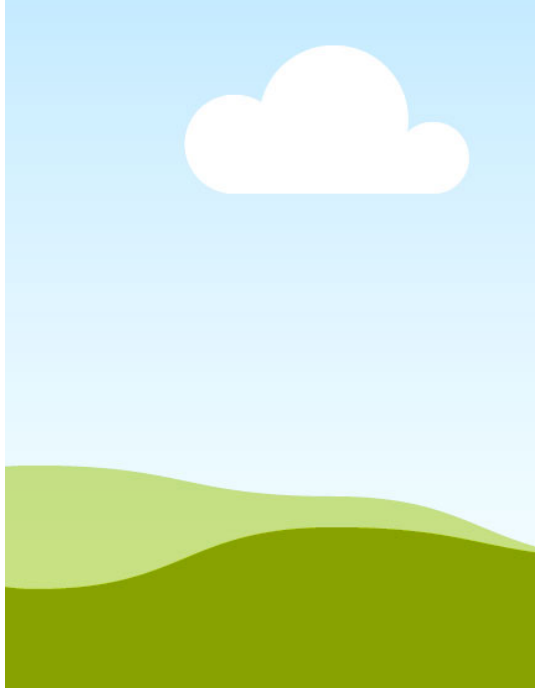
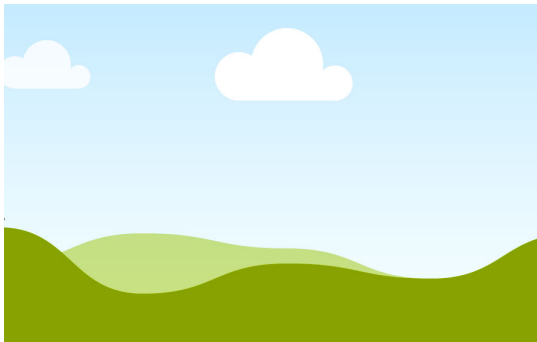
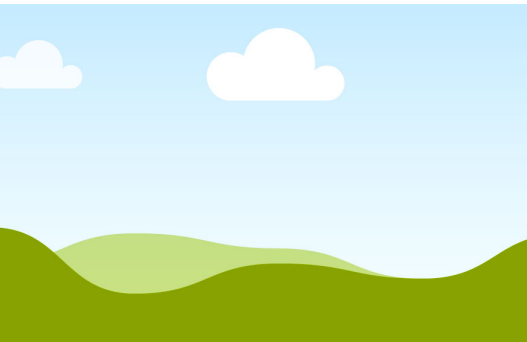
I am so thankful for a full week of school, and nice weather. I think I'm itching for summer vacation. We only have 18 more school days until the last day of school! Whoohoo!

Dear Parents,

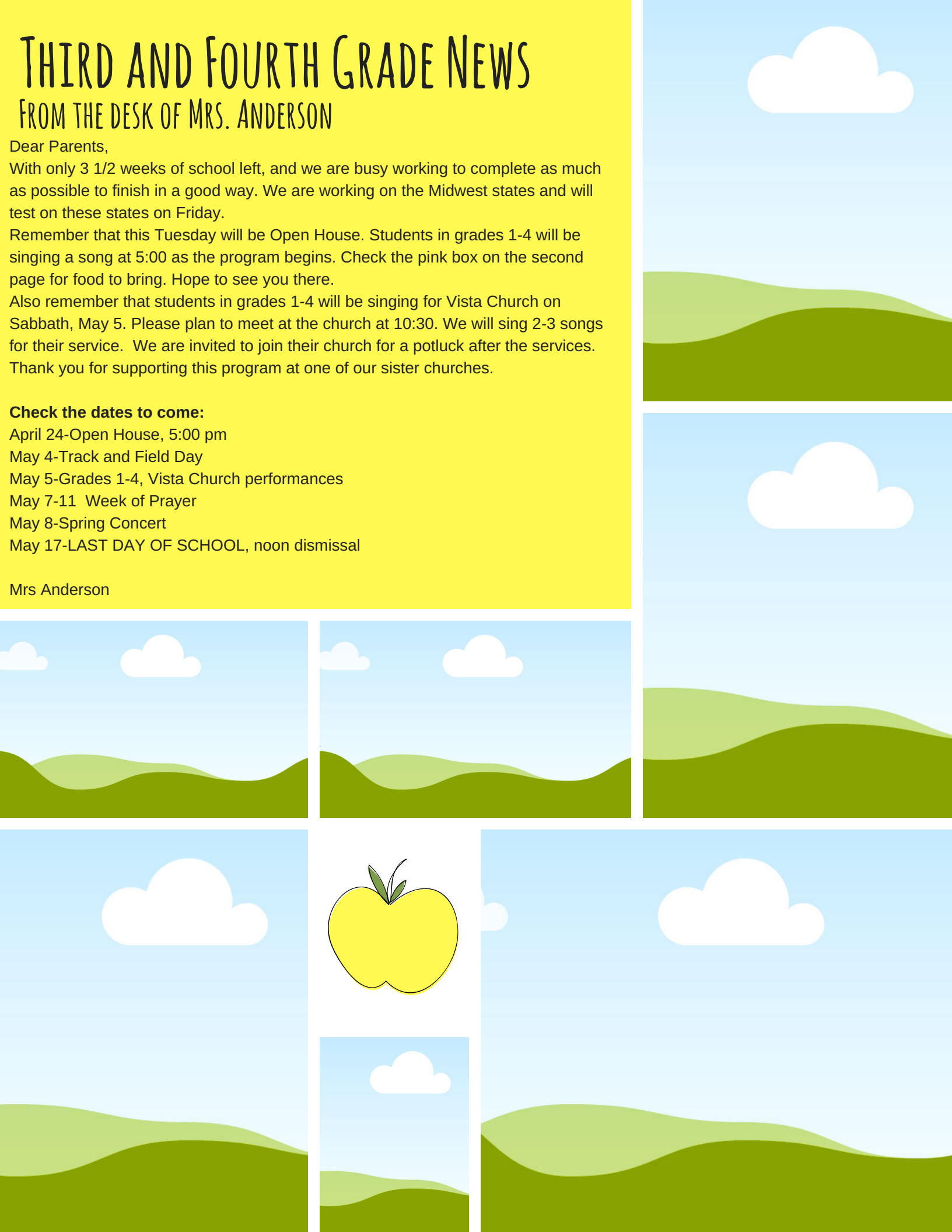
With only 3 1/2 weeks of school left, and we are busy working to complete as much as possible to finish in a good way. We are working on the Midwest states and will test on these states on Friday.
