The conference and board are currently in a phase of accepting applications from all interested teachers and principals. We hope by mid March to have screened the field of applicants to a few who most closely meet the qualifications as envisioned. Then in the second half of March we plan to interview a few of the most qualified candidates. HMS staff will be included in this process as their input is critical in finding someone who integrates well with everyone. It is the hope of the HMS School Board that a hiring decision will be made by the end of March.

Although there is an urgency in this process it is also a fluid process and the board wants to remain fully open to God's leading. We also want to solicit your prayers and suggestions. If there is anyone you can suggest who is well qualified please communicate that to me.

I want to thank our HMS staff for their hard work and dedication to christian education. Although this may be an unsettling time, I am confident that God will honor our prayerful and diligent efforts to find a dedicated and capable spiritual leader.
